Cool Ways to Save Food and Money

Your freezer can be one of the greatest resources in your home to help you save money on food. Whether storing leftovers or simply planning convenience meals ahead, here are a few tips to help you maximize the use of your freezer:

- Use containers, foils, and wraps designed for the freezer, so they’re thick enough to lock in moisture.
- When freezing food long term in glass, make sure the glass is either tempered or specifically labeled for freezing. Since even freezer-safe glass can crack as food expands, be sure to leave about ¾” of space between the top of the food and the lid.
- Freeze food in small portions, which will help it freeze faster. The faster food freezes, the fresher it will taste when it’s thawed.
- Slice bread and halve bagels before freezing for easy, one-person servings. Store bagel halves back-to-back so they’re less likely to stick together.
- Allow hot foods to cool to room temperature in smaller containers before freezing. Then leave plenty of

space around the container in the freezer, so the cold air can circulate around it to speed freezing.

- Eggs can be frozen, as long as they are out of the shell and beaten. Stash yolks and whites separately. (If you’re freezing only yolks, beat each of them with about a teaspoon of sugar first to keep them fresh.)
- Separate leftover pancakes with wax paper before freezing them to prevent sticking. To reheat, simply pop them from the freezer into the toaster or toaster oven.
- Fruit such as cubed melon, peaches, mangoes, watermelon, and bananas can be frozen for later use in making smoothies or margaritas.
- Freeze broths, sauces, and other liquids flat in freezer bags, then stand them up sideways for storage.
- Freeze bananas whole or mash them up and freeze them in a plastic bag to use later for making banana bread.
- Wrap food tightly and squeeze out as much air as possible. This will help to stop ice formation and prevent freezer burn.
